INDING THE LINE THE PILOT

Meet Qwan'Tez Stiggers - post production

Raised as one of 13 siblings who, despite the odds, rose to become a multi-position stand out on his high school football team. Unfortunately, his charter school was so small that his efforts went little noticed by media and major colleges. Qwan'Tez accepted a scholarship to Lane College, a small HBCU in Jackson, TN.

In his freshman year, before getting a chance to play a single down he was devastated by the tragic death of his father and withdrew from college. Dashing his NFL dreams.

No one goes to the NFL without college.



INDING THE UNDING THE UNDING THE PILOT

We find Qwan'Tez as a full-time semi-truck washer recovering from depression and follow him as he goes on a ground-breaking journey from an indoor FCL to the Canadian National Football League. Winning rookie of the year there, coaches sought to change the rules to allow him to play in the East-West Shrine Bowl and his then own NFL scout-attended Pro Day at his high school, another first.

As the NFL Draft takes place in Detroit, we film Qwan'Tez and his family watching from home in Atlanta, waiting to see if the his underdog story becomes a dream: an NFL team calling his name.

Spoiler: Qwan'Tez becomes a New York Jet, and one of just 3 players to be drafted without college experience.

TINDING THE WHO WILL YOU MEET

Kwanna Stiggers | Supporting

Meet Kwanna Stiggers, Qwan'Tez's unbelievably supportive mother in a blended family of 13 children with 4 sons being her biological children. It was her well-honed mother's intuition and insight that allowed her to imagine better for her uniquely talented but severely depressed son. He'd given up his NFL dreams after the untimely death of his father, Rayves Harrison. She never did.

Qwantayvious Stiggers | Supporting

Meet Qwantayvious Stiggers, the eldest brother of Qwan'Tez and biggest influence in his life outsider of his mom.

Cheyenee McClain | Supporting

Meet Cheyenee McClain, the fiancée of Qwan'Tez and mother of his 2-year old son.

Coach Bernard Goodrum | Supporting

Meet Bernard Goodrum, head football coach at B.E.S.T. Academy, a small charter school in Atlanta that had only 27 players on its football team when Qwan'Tez played for him.

Frederick Lyles | Supporting

Meet Frederick Lyles, a sports agent & owner of NZone Sports Management that represents Qwan'Tez Stiggers. He has represented Pro Bowl and All-Pro corners in the past such as AJ Bouye and Chris Harris. Frederick believes Qwan'Tez is just as good as those guys were, and that speaks to what his abilities are at this stage of the game.

Meet John Jenkins, who coached Stiggers in the FCF and who was also a former assistant coach on Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League. He recognized Qwan'Tez's special ability and lobbied for his former team to give a kid with no college experience a shot.



Edwards made history last fall when she became the first Black woman to play for Team USA hockey, which will earn her a sport on the USA Olympic team.

Edwards led Wisconsin last year to an NCAA women's hockey title.



Bob Huggins

Huggins is No. 3 in all-time wins by Div. 1 men's college basketball coaches.

He was forced out by West Virginia last season. He hopes to comeback to chase the top spot in all time wins.

McCane, 29, is the oldest boxer on the Team USA boxing Olympic team.

McCane didn't begin boxing until she was a senior in high school but she briefly left the sport after the death of her brother.



Xaivian Lee

Lee is a sophomore point guard for Princeton. Lee, a Toronto native, attends an Ivy League school, but has drawn the attention of the NBA.

Out of high school, he was stereotyped because he's Asian and because of his slim frame at 6-foot-3.


